Survey of Contact Lens Prescribing in Canada 2026

The Centre for Ocular Research & Education and the School of Optometry and Vision Science, University of Waterloo along with other research centres around the world, are collaborating with Eurolens Research, Department of Optometry, UMIST, Manchester, England, on a study to investigate the current state of contact lens prescribing in their respective countries. The benefit of this survey is to enable you as a practitioner to gain an understanding of current contact lens prescribing trends in Canada, as well as in other countries worldwide.

No identifying information is being requested about patients or practitioners and only the aggregated information will be published and all information pertaining to the study **will be strictly confidential**. The data will be securely stored for 5 years within the Centre for Ocular Research & Education. The results will be published in optometric journals during the next year.
